Tasks and responsibilities

- Transfer information from the Museum's paper registers to our digital database.
- Re-pack objects so they are stored safely and are easier to access.
- Adhere to the best practises of object handling and packing museum collections.
- Adhere to the health and safety guidelines for museums, specifically hazardous objects.

Skills and experience

- Experience helping as part of a team.
- It would be ideal for volunteers to have IT and database skills and experience.
- Previous experience of working or volunteering in museums or collections would be helpful.
- Skills in arts and crafts would also be ideal as the re-packing may involve creating boxes/enclosures for objects.

Time Commitment

- Our project sessions will be on Mondays and Thursdays. Each session will last 1
 ½ hours.
- We ask for a commitment of one session per week for at least 6 weeks, but it
 would be ideal for participants to be involved in the entire project which will last
 until March 2027.

- Induction training and on-going support.
- Reimbursement of agreed travel expenses.

- If childcare is a barrier to involvement in the project, we can re-imburse for childcare expenses during the volunteering time, this is to be agreed prior to starting.
